DEVELOPING COMMUNITIES

Our parent club Renown is located at Kotahena, in Colombo one of the hotbeds of football talent in Sri Lanka. Unfortunately the vices in the community like gangs and drugs have been a menace as most kids don't continue their education. As football isn't fully professional it isn't a viable career choice. So it's always a struggle to convince the parents to send their kids to school, to football as well as keep young talented players in football.





We have been active in the community for more than 40 years and have their trust. The Community Academy is a big success with more than 100 kids attending regular training. They are given refreshments and their training equipment are provided for free. The interest of the kids shows the love they have for football. The goal is not only to train the young players but to make sure that these kids don't fall into problems & vices in the local community.



We have been teaching the kids social awareness and values through fun games during training. We also promote unity as we have kids from all ethnic groups. We have been given a room in the pavilion to teach English & IT to the kids. Our long term goal is to build our own structure in the ground which is owned by the local municipality so that we can have a small Futsal court, with rooms to teach English, IT and social projects to the kids.

DEVELOPING COMMUNITIES

Unfortunately the community was the target of the first Easter bomb blast in Sri Lanka in 2019 as the first bomb detonated at the Shrine of St. Anthony Church. It was a period of mourning for the community as several people lost their lives. The only solace was none of the Academy kids were casualties of the blast as most of them had attended midnight mass. Unfortunately the cousin of the Academy owner's wife was a victim of the blast. Her son was seriously injured but has recovered now after multiple plastic surgeries due to severe burns. His recovery was looked at as the glimmer of light from this tragedy and he has now started to play football at the Academy.



It is in this backdrop the Academy was given an opportunity to attend 2019 Football for Friendship event in Madrid, Spain. For the community it was a moment to rejoice as 2 players from the community and the community coach were part of contingent. This is something which won't be easily forgotten by the community and the Academy will always be grateful to Gazprom & Football for Friendship for giving them this opportunity at their moment of need.



In the community it was the Under 12 team who carried their hope as the first ever tournament for Academies was conducted by the Football Federation of Sri Lanka. Initially they faced several setbacks. The Easter blast which had shaken the young players psychologically, then they lost one of their stars of the team who passed away due to illness, severe weather which postponed the final round of the competition and gender bias as the girl in the team who had trained and played with the team for 2 years wasn't allowed to play as per the rules of the tournament.

DEVELOPING COMMUNITIES



Despite all the obstacles the team was victorious and it was a story worth telling. Apart from players from the local community the team had players from all over Sri Lanka who were part of our network and was a symbol for unity as they had players from different faiths and ethnic groups. Manchester City Football Club invited the team for the Man City Abu Dhabi Cup but unfortunately due to COVID-19 the tournament was cancelled for this year and the young kids missed out on the competition and for several players their first trip away from Sri Lanka.



The participation at F4F event and winning the Under 12 Championship has created a buzz in the community with more parents wanting to have their kids attend training and a ray of hope inside the kids that they can succeed in life through football.

What we have learnt from our Community Academy we are planning to implement in other parts of Sri Lanka. We are identifying places where there is keen interest in football but had faced communal issues in the past. As the first step we have started a Community Academy in Kilinochchi which was ravaged by the Civil War in the past. Already more than 80 kids are coming for training and the interest from the local community has been amazing.



We have earmarked Gampola, Batticaloa and Galle as our next destinations and the goal is to get the kids from the different community academies to interact with each other through matches, workshops, trips etc so that we have a new generation who don't fall into the trap of communal tension.



We will be working with the local communities to get them involved in the social projects. This will give a sense of belonging to the community. In the long term they can get infrastructure development through local and international agencies.



Girls football is at it's infancy in Sri Lanka. The truth is the fact that girls are taking up football itself is a big achievement. Apart from Army, Navy, Police and Air Force there are no other clubs which has a women's team. In such a scenario girls playing football is because of the passion they have considering even now girls playing football is looked at unusually.

GIRLS FOOTBALL



We realized that there is lot of potential for girls football in rural areas. In some of these places girls football is more popular than boys football and their success in school tournaments has given the communities pride on their achievements.



As a pilot project a girls Academy was initiated in Polonnaruwa as the girls come from very poor families but have been excelling school tournaments for several years. The kids were provided all training equipment and the Academy has been a big success. The Academy team became the champions of the first ever inter academy tournament conducted by the Football Federation of Sri Lanka for girls.

The Academy and the girls are the pride of Polonnaruwa. They have been covered by the press and recently even the Minister of Sports, Hon. Namal Rajapaksa visited them and assured them his support. As we work with the schools in the district the education of the girls are also taken care of and monitored. Most of the girls come from farming and day worker families but this has given a real sense of empowerment to the girls. Interest in the programme has skyrocketed among parents and girls. Presently there are 100 girls in the Academy in the 10-16 age group but more are waiting to join the programme.



The next step is to build a pavilion with changing rooms, rooms to teach English, IT and social projects to the kids along with a Futsal court.



We are planning similar Academies in Jaffna, Anuradhapura, Hatton and Batticaloa where there is talent but the girls come from poor families. So the goal is to empower them as well as create a life pathway for them through football.



As for the capital of Colombo the interest in girls football is low and only 3 schools have a girls football team. A programme is to be implemented to get girls to play football in Colombo. First for fun and then if interested as a sport. The Education Ministry has given their full support to the project. he achievements of Ilavenyl Senthilkumar, who like all girls in Colombo started playing football only when she was 10, in the Football for Friendship circle and in online competitions will be used as a motivational tool to bring in the girls.
